

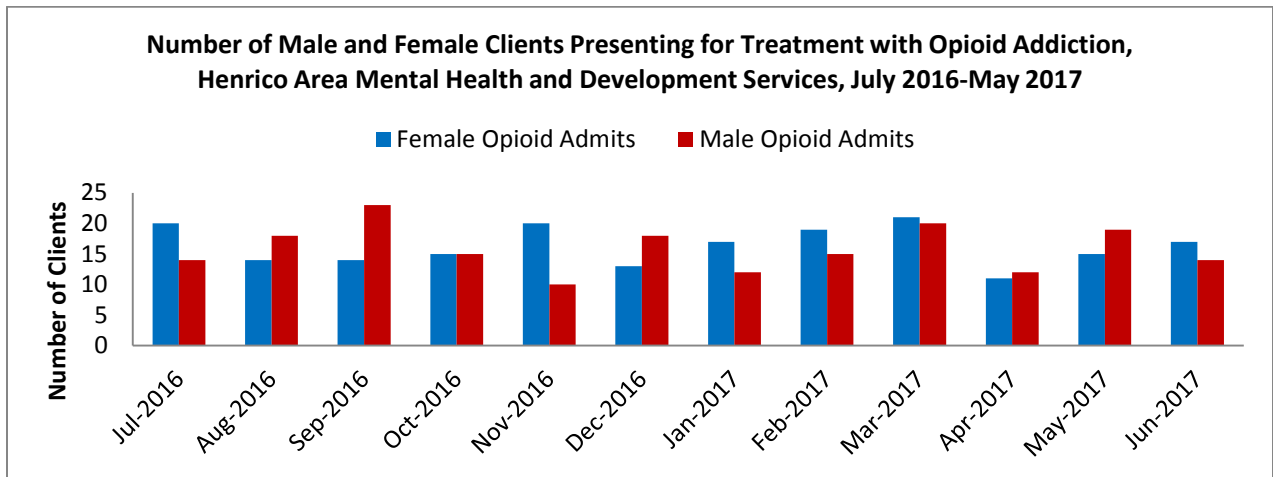
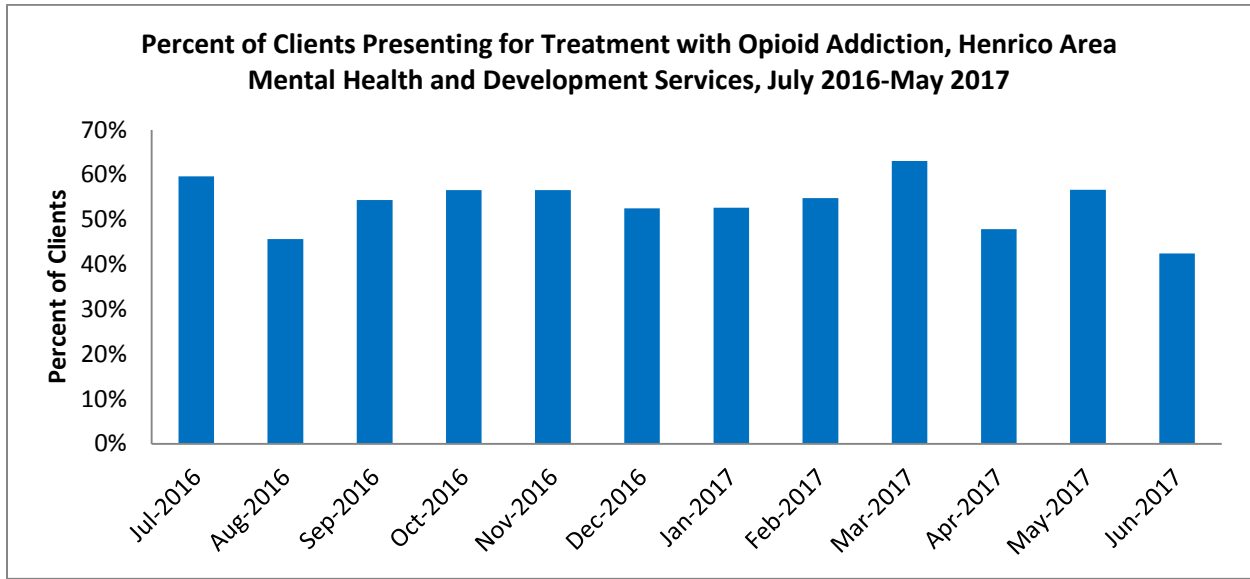

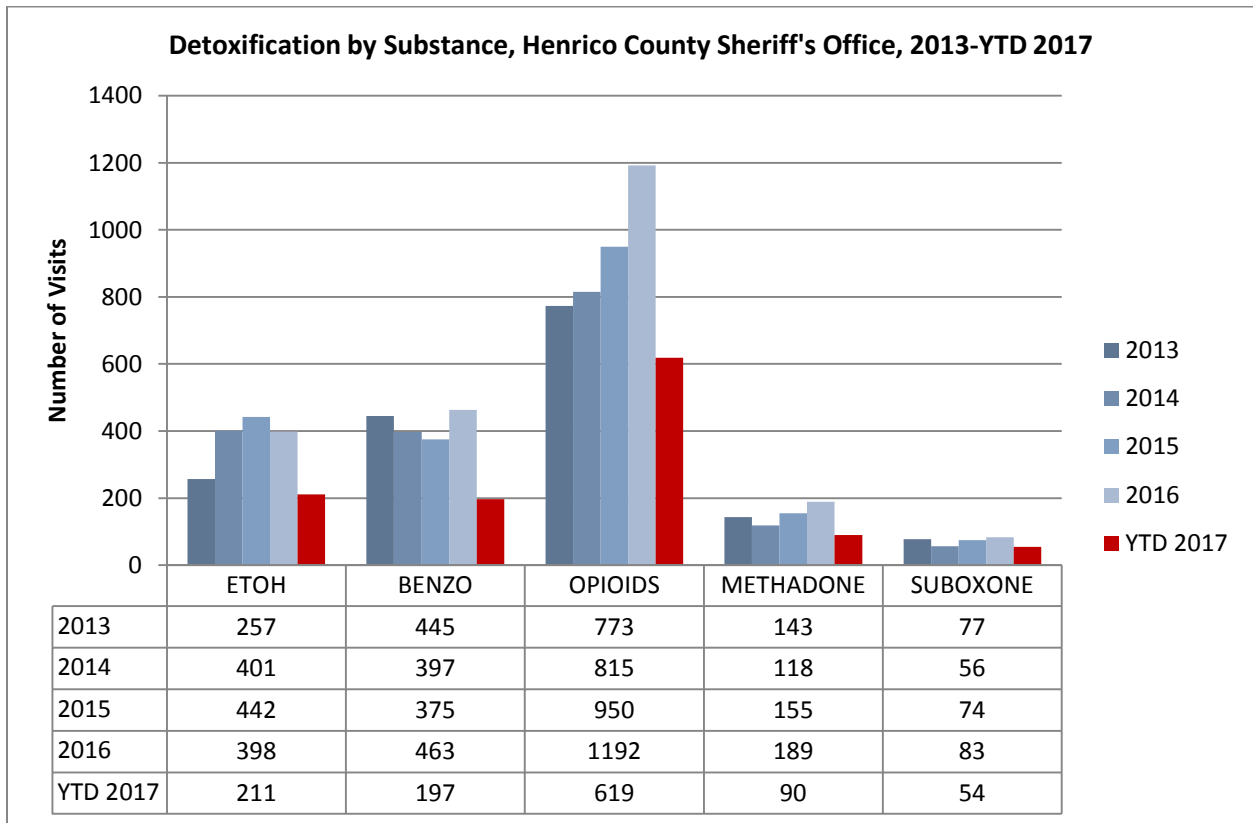

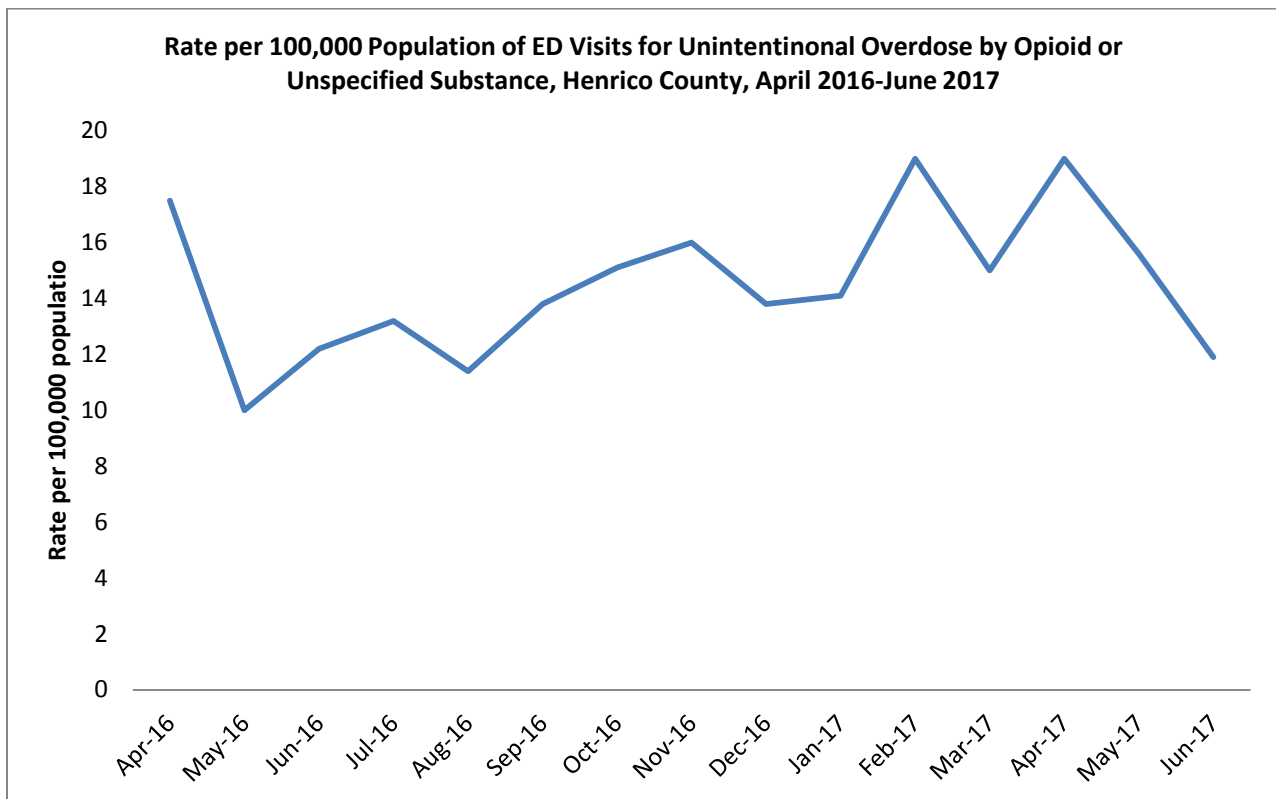

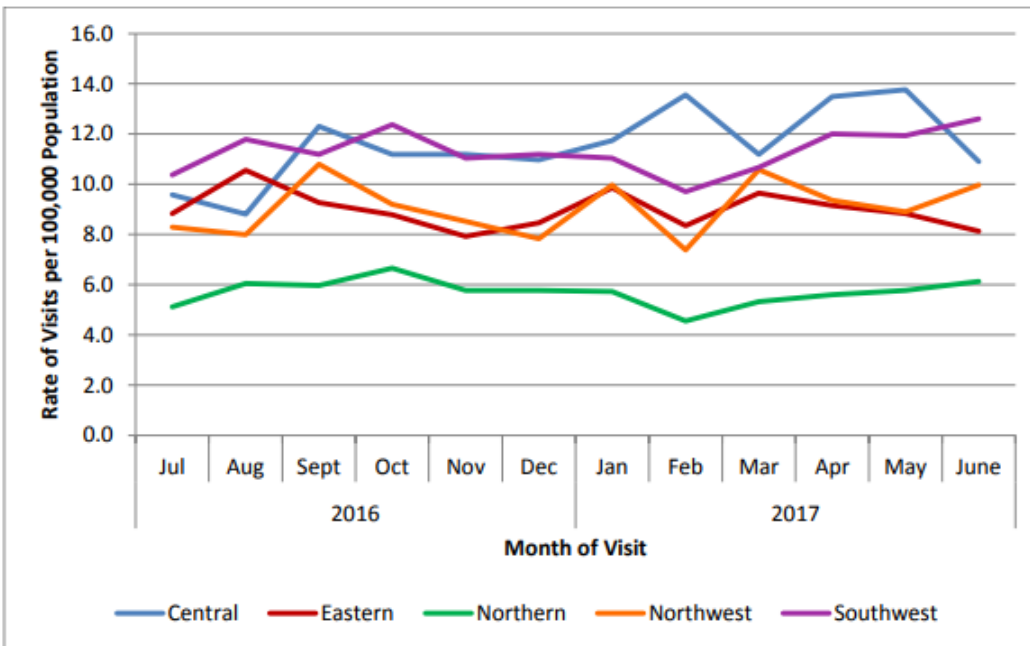

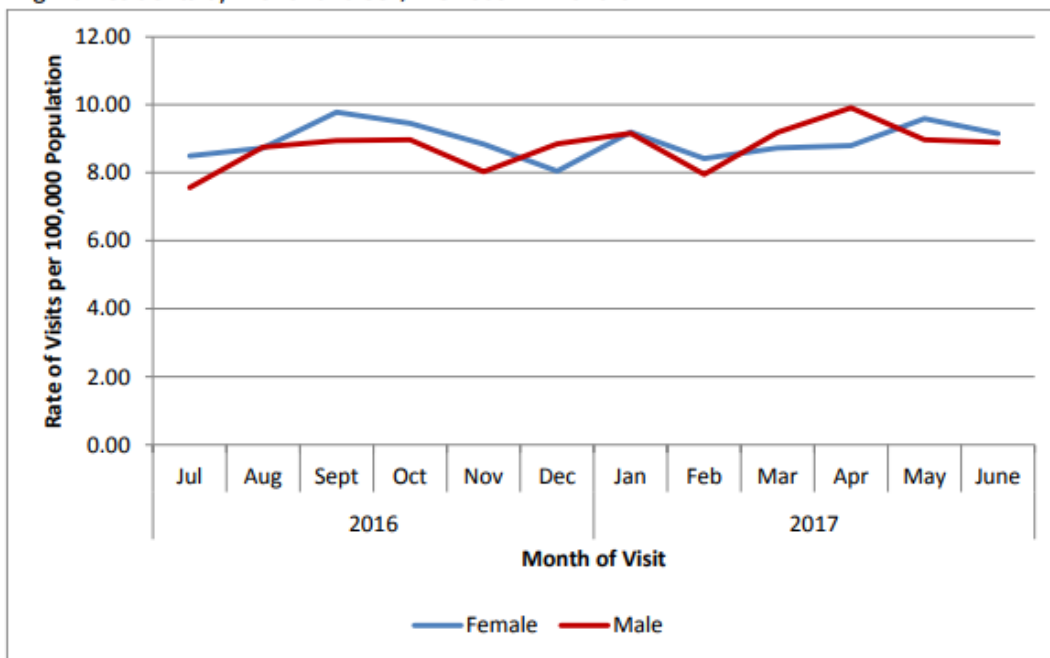
\*\*§ Between May and June 2017, fluctuations in reporting to VDH were observed. Before June, 82 acute care hospital EDs and 13 free-standing EDs submitted data. In June, one healthcare system in the Eastern Health Planning Region became unable to provide data. As a result, 77 out of an expected 82 acute care hospital EDs and 13 free-standing EDs reported data for June; any observed decreases in the count or rate of overdoses in the Eastern Region might be artificially low because of this change in reporting. Additionally, one acute care hospital ED in the Northwest Health Planning Region improved its data quality during June so that visits can be attributed to overdoses more accurately, thereby increasing the counts for that area. Please consider these changes in reporting when interpreting the contents of the ESSENCE report.
