






Rate of Fatal Opioid Overdose by Locality of Overdose and Year of Death, 2007-2016




January to September count of ED Visits for Unintentional Overdose by **Opioid or Unspecified Substance** among Central Region Residents by Year.



January to September count of ED Visits for Unintentional Overdose by **Heroin** among Central Region Residents by Year.


